Mandates are passed by Congress to help specific Classes. Goals are the efforts of every Federal Agency to meet but are not required by law. Percentages are the Goals or Mandates that the Federal Government have set for all contracting. Sole Source is when any Agency picks one source for contracting. Set Asides are based on competitive bidding within a SBA designated Program. Mentor - Protégé allows small businesses to partner with a large business to meet the Federal goals and mandates. Preferences are given to SBA designated programs.

\*Supreme Court Ruling on Kingdomware Technologies, Inc vs. United States requires that Veterans are a designated class for protection. Prior to the Supreme Court rulling the Veteran First program mandated the VA to award 43% of all ccontracts to Vet Biz designated comapanies. The full effects of the Supreme Court ruling is still under review. The Department of Veteran Affairs Memorandum of July 25, 2016 is the ruling authority. And as of 10/1/20 all Veteran designations will be administered by the US Small Business Administration according to Defense Act 2017.
